Manitoba Education is currently facilitating engagement sessions regarding their updated Anti-Racism Policy. Park West School Division is committed to fostering an inclusive and equitable learning environment for all. As a key part of this mission, we stand firmly in support of anti-racism education.

Racism, religious intolerance, homophobia, gender-based violence, resistance to the inclusion of persons with differing abilities, and other forms of discrimination are still all too evident in society. The events of the past year, both provincially and globally, have highlighted the urgent need for confronting systemic racism and prejudice in all its forms. Given the pivotal role that education has in enacting social change, we recognize our responsibility as a school division to actively address these issues.

We acknowledge the historical and contemporary manifestations of racism that have affected Indigenous people in Canada and resulted in the dispossession of their lands and the destruction of their languages, cultures, spiritualities, and communities. Park West School Division respects the Treaties that were made on these territories, we acknowledge the harms and the mistakes of the past, and we dedicate ourselves to move forward in partnership with Indigenous communities, in the spirit of reconciliation and collaboration.

Contemporary research overwhelmingly supports the importance of anti-racism education in fostering inclusive and equitable learning environments. To that end, Park West School Division remains dedicated to integrating the latest findings from academic research into our approach to anti-racism education, ensuring that our work is informed by the most effective strategies and methodologies available.
